The Superintendent discussed with the board that there will be policies that need to be updated. The Superintendent pointed out that a board committee needs to be established to discuss the Southern Cloud agreement. This committee would meet with the Southern Cloud board committee to iron out the process. Joe File, Jon Stillwell and Kelsey Adams agreed to sit on this committee. The Superintendent thanked all of the board members for all of their hard work on the bond issue. He especially thanked them for staying on the high ground and sticking to the district's core values. He thanked the board clerk for her work with the bond. He also wanted to put a thank you to the public in the Beloit Call, on social media and on KVSV. The signs regarding the USD 273 bond need to be taken down from supporter's yards. President File would like to thank Mr. Travis for going above and beyond his duties on the bond issue.

The Superintendent gave the unofficial results of the bond. They are as follows:

Proposition #1: 1,447 Yes Votes; 1,021 No Votes Proposition #2: 1,057 Yes Votes; 1,395 No Votes Proposition #3: 1,103 Yes Votes; 1,352 No Votes

There were 79 provisional votes, with only 51 of these votes counting.

A motion was made by Ludwig, seconded by Stillwell, to accept the Food Drive request from the BJSHS Student Council and make December 20, 2024 a half day of school if the food drive goal is met. Motion carried: 7 Yeas, 0 Nays.

A motion was made by Krier, seconded by Thompson, to approve the additions of Spring Track Usage, Track Meet Usage and the Bus Requirements to the Facility Use Agreement. Motion carried: 7 Yeas, 0 Nays.

A motion was made by Krier, seconded by Adams, to approve board policy sections A, B (with changes) and C as presented. Motion carried: 7 Yeas, 0 Nays.

A motion was made by Adams, seconded by Cousland, to approve board policy GAOE with the legislative changes as presented. Motion carried: 7 Yeas, 0 Nays.

A motion was made by Thompson, seconded by Stillwell, to approve board policy GARI-Family Medical Leave to include the USD 273 plan as presented. Motion carried: 7 Yeas, 0 Nays.

A motion was made by Ludwig, seconded by Cousland, to approve board policy GARIB-Sick Leave Sharing to include the USD 273 plan as presented. Motion carried: 7 Yeas, 0 Nays.

A motion was made by Stillwell, seconded by Thompson, to approve board policy GBA-Compensation Guides and Contracts to include the USD 273 plan as presented. Motion carried: 7 Yeas, 0 Nays.

A motion was made by Thompson, seconded by Cousland, to approve board policy JBCC – Enrollment of Nonresident Students as presented. Motion carried: 7 Yeas, 0 Nays.

Stillwell made the motion to approve the Master Service Agreement with Presence for the remaining of the semester for virtual therapist for \$28,226.12, seconded by Thompson. Motion carried: 7 Yeas, 0 Nays.

Adams made the motion to approve the additions of Cody Richards as Assistant High School Wrestling Coach and Garry Lowry as Assistant High School Track coach, seconded by Krier. Motion carried: 7 Yeas, 0 Nays.

A motion was made by Krier, seconded by Adams, to approve the changes to the 2023-24 GAAP Resolution to have the correct fiscal year end date as June 30, 2024. Motion carried: 7 Yeas, 0 Nays.
