Richard Sedlacek and Nichole McDaniel left the meeting at 6:39 P.M.

The Superintendent gave a legislative update. The governor wants to put \$75 million new money into special education. This can be voted on separately, so this is promising. The Superintendent suggests approving the resurfacing of the parking lot later in the meeting. This is something that has seemed to improve the parking lot over the last few years. The Superintendent explained that the Summer Enrichment Program has previously been paid for with ESSER III funds in the past couple of years and before that the District was reimbursed by the bus company for this program. The Superintendent would like to continue this program as he feels it is very beneficial for our students; however, it is something the district will have to fund. The Special Education Cooperative agreement was read through with the Special Education Director explaining the changes and additions. This agreement will be brought back to the board to be approved at a later date. There were 33-34 three-year old applications that were sent out and 59 four-year old applications sent out this year. KASB has finished with their review and update of the district's board policies. These policies will be brought to the board for their approval.

The Superintendent gave an update on the upcoming bond.
