He superintendent would like the district to focus on being above average on our test scores. There have been a few adjustments with staff to help address these issues. The district's health insurance had an increase in 13% for the 2025-26 school year. The Southern Cloud mapping will be taken to the state and asked to be approved the way it is currently. The 3 year old preschool building is in place. Budget information was given to the board. The total taxes levied has been increasing over the last three years.
