Morgan Bailey gave the PTO report.

Stephanie Porter gave the Site Council report.

Katyanna Gray gave the Student Council report.

The Superintendent discussed the needs assessment. As of this date, Beloit Elementary School has 502 students and Beloit Jr-Sr High School has 358 students. The Southern Cloud Cooperative Agreement was signed by board members since it had already been approved at the August board meeting. The KASB Roundtable meeting was discussed. Current school funding and special education funding was discussed at the Roundtable. Also, at the Roundtable, At-Risk funds were discussed. In the next five years, teachers are not going to be an allowable resource to use At-Risk funds. Krier said it is challenging to get At-Risk students due to parents not completing the forms and this is how the district gets funding. Rick Nobles and Susan Nenonen, Excellence K-12, talked about what the survey showed. The points they feel need to be made for the next bond elections are: 1) We heard you; 2) We scaled back; 3) Commitment to transparency; 4) Benefits to ALL.

Board policies sections A and B were discussed. The Board wanted to add to BCBJ News Coverage that they have to notify the Superintendent and the Board of Education will vote at the beginning of the board meeting that the meeting will be recorded. The Board also wanted to change BCBI to read "Any patron may request addition of a specific agenda item and shall notify the superintendent three business days prior to the meeting and state the reason(s) for the request". The Board would also like to remove Board Policy BK. Therefore, a motion was made by Thompson, seconded by Ludwig, to table the approval of the board policies. Motion carried: 6 Yeas, 0 Nays.

The superintendent gave an update on the bond.

A motion was made by Thompson, seconded by Krier, to approve the bid from Watts & Son for \$49,500 for a Carrier 25 ton 460V 3-phase 2-stage cooling, 2 stage gas heating roof top unit for the Beloit Jr-Sr High School. Motion carried: 6 Yeas, 0 Nays.

A motion was made by Krier, seconded by Ludwig, to approve adding the sentences "The employee must return to work before being paid for sick leave sharing. Exception: A letter of intent to return to employment must be signed if this occurs at the end of a school year for payment of days." To Board Policy GARIB-Sick Leave Sharing. Motion carried: 6 Yeas, 0 Nays.

A motion was made by Krier, seconded by Ludwig, to approve the amendments to the Facility Usage Agreement to read Fall Track Usage: \$100 per session and \$1,000 per season; Spring Track Usage: TBD; Track Meets: TBD; and change Cassiopeia to Vendor Craft Fair. Motion carried: 6 Yeas, 0 Nays.

A motion was made by Ludwig, seconded by Thompson, to approve the changes to the sponsor list for 2024-2025 school year. Motion carried: 6 Yeas, 0 Nays.

A motion was made by Adams, seconded by Cousland, to approve the Grow Your Own application for Carli Denning. Motion carried: 6 Yeas, 0 Nays.

A motion was made by Ludwig, seconded by Adams, to approve the Patterson Education Grant for Madison Cashatt for 9 credit hours. Motion carried: 6 Yeas, 0 Nays.

A motion was made by Adams, seconded by Ludwig, to appoint Amber Krier as the KASB Governmental Relations Network representative. Motion carried: 6 Yeas, 0 Nay.

Thompson moved that the Board of Education go into executive session at 9:55 P.M. for the purpose of discussing personnel matters on non-elected personnel and their contractual obligations because if this matter were discussed in open session it might invade the privacy of those discussed and that the Board of Education reconvene into open session at 10:10 P.M. in this room with Jeff Travis remaining. The motion was seconded by Ludwig. Motion carried: 6 Yeas, 0 Nays.

A motion was made by Ludwig, seconded by Adams, to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried: 6 Yeas, 0 Nays.
